




Urbanisation in Uzbekistan


Population growth of Uzbekistan






City & rural population growth in Uzb




City & rural population of other countries




Population growth rate in Uzbekistan




Carbon dioxide emissions per capita in Uzbekistan




Carbon dioxide emissions per capita: other countries (2019)

Land use

 According to statistics each hectare irrigated land can provide for 8,2 people. However during the last 30 years the irrigating area per person was reduced from 0,22 to 0,12 ha, as population is increasing much faster than the area of irrigating lands.

Cities of the Uzbekistan

• In Uzbekistan's 120 cities and 115 towns lives 51% of all population. Internal migrants search for jobs first of all in Tashkent and cities included in an orbit of the large Tashkent agglomerate - Almaliq, Angren, Akhangaran, Yangiuyl, Chirchik. That is Uzbekistan is a country with one large megalopolis.

Annually from 15 up to 40 % of all families, have one or more family member who is a labour migrant.



All economic reforms in Uzbekistan are based on strategy of transition from agrarian-industrial to industrial-agrarian state.



Urban policies of Uzbekistan

 The effective development of a city as an industrial centre, requires an advanced infrastructure: a stable supply of water, gas and electricity, management of wastewater, efficient urban transport.



 About 13 % of the inhabitants of the Republic or 38 % of all urban population live in small and average sized cities with up to 70 thousand inhabitants. The population of the most part of cities of the Republic is from 12 up to 30 thousand inhabitants.





 Migration of the village population is in many respects an irreversible process and does not give in to suppression. Aspiration of the peasants to move to the cities is quite understandable as the conditions of living and work in cities are better.




